**MSBA Accelerated Repair Program /Beechwood Knoll/ Merrymount Schools**

**Ordered:** That the City appropriates Six Million Seven Hundred Fifty Two Thousand One Hundred Forty Five Dollars (\$6,752,145.00), for the purpose of paying costs of replacing the Roof, Windows, and Doors, at Beechwood Knoll School, located at 225 Fenno St. and the Roof at Merrymount School, located at 4 Agawam Rd, all in the City of Quincy, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto(the "Projects"), which proposed repair Projects would materially extend the useful life of each school and preserve assets that otherwise are capable of supporting the required educational program, and for which the City has applied for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority ("MSBA"), said amount to be expended under the direction of the City of Quincy Public Buildings Department. To meet this appropriation the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under M.G.L. Chapter 44, or pursuant to any other enabling authority. The City acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and if the MSBA's Board of Directors votes to invite the City to collaborate with the MSBA on these proposed repair projects, any costs the City incurs in excess of any grant that may be approved by and received from the MSBA for the Projects shall be the sole responsibility of the City; provided further that any grant the City may receive from the MSBA for the Projects shall not exceed the lesser of (1) 68.96% of eligible, approved project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (2) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement or Agreements that may be executed between the City and the MSA with respect to the Projects

**Further Ordered:** That the City Treasurer is authorized to file an application with The Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds or notes of the City authorized by this vote, and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts may require.



RE: Additional information, Pine Hill Cemetery expansion project

Tonight before you is a request for additional funds to allow the City to obtain permits for the expansion of Pine Hill Cemetery, as well as some routine purchases the Cemetery Department makes each year in order to carry out its mission. This memo serves to provide additional background information on the Pine Hill Cemetery expansion project, as we are gradually drawing near to having the necessary permits in hand to pursue the project.

Currently the Cemetery Department sells graves only at Pine Hill Cemetery on an as needed basis; there are no pre-need sales there, and there are no additional graves available for purchase at any other city owned cemetery. We project that we have only enough remaining graves at Pine Hill to see us through the next couple years, which has necessitated the pursuit of the expansion of Pine Hill. We envision an expansion of roughly 7 acres, allowing us to provide for the burial needs of hundreds, if not thousands, of families in the years to come.

The area into which we propose to expand is environmentally sensitive as it is home to snakes on the State's endangered species list, which requires us to obtain permits from the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife. It is also in a wetland resource area, which necessitates obtaining an Order of Conditions from the city's Conservation Commission. In order to obtain these required permits, we have hired attorneys, engineers and wildlife specialists to assist us. My expectation is that this request will be the last specifically for permitting needs.

I am happy to answer any questions you may have on this project. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

**An Order Related to the Underground Economy  
The Misclassification of Employees on Construction Sites**

**WHEREAS**, Quincy has long held community standards regarding responsible employment, just wages, health care and safety on the work site; and

**WHEREAS**, there is significant building construction occurring in Quincy; and

**WHEREAS**, construction costs can be artificially reduced as a result of a practice that is widespread in the construction industry: contractors illegally misclassifying their employees as “independent contractors.”; and

**WHEREAS**, by misclassifying employees as independent contractors, these contractors achieve very significant illegal savings in labor costs by avoiding employer payroll taxes, workers compensation premiums, and overtime obligations; and

**WHEREAS**, many contractors achieve the same illegal objectives simply by paying employees cash under the table or, in some cases, particularly with undocumented immigrant workers, just not paying them at all; and

**WHEREAS**, these practices within the “underground economy” amount to nothing other than tax and insurance fraud, and have been condemned as such by federal and state officials: and

**WHEREAS**, wholly apart from depriving workers of significant labor law protections, contractors operating in the underground economy deprive federal, state and local governments of substantial revenues, and achieve such substantial illegal cost savings that they make it impossible for honest contractors to compete.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED**, that the Quincy City Council hold hearings as to the extent of such practices in Quincy projects past and present and that the City Council collect testimony from labor organizations, state and local officials, contractors and development companies both to the impact and cost of these practices. Also, that the City Council may forward recommendations for oversight that would both limit and discourage such practices in the City of Quincy.
