



RE: *Paul Bregoli – G.L. c. 268A, §20(d) Approval Process*

DATE: April 26, 2016

Included on your May 2 Agenda is a request by School Committee member Paul Bregoli for this body to approve a so-called Section 20(d) exemption, thereby allowing him to become the girls' head basketball coach at North Quincy High School. Your vote, if affirmative, would approve Mr. Bregoli's appointment to the position notwithstanding the fact that he is on the School Committee and it is the school department (overseen by the School Committee) which is the "municipal agency" entering into the coaching contract. The following facts may assist you in considering whether to vote approval.

Mr. Bregoli responded to a publicly-posted advertisement for coaching candidates that drew six applicants for the position. A committee of four - consisting of the school principal, the athletic director, a QEA representative and a parent representative - interviewed the six candidates and the committee ultimately selected Mr. Bregoli.

Prior to interviewing, Mr. Bregoli sought and obtained advice from the State Ethics Commission; I have attached a copy of the advisory provided him to this memo. Mr. Bregoli felt going to the commission directly was appropriate, due to the fact he is an independently-elected official, and he was aware of the "appearance of impropriety" his candidacy would spawn. As you will see, staff counsel at State Ethics advised what steps Mr. Bregoli need take should he be hired as coach. The key fact upon which she relied, and you may as well, is the fact that school committee members in Quincy are "special municipal employees." That category allows for exemptions such as the one sought here.

In addition, Mr. Bregoli was required to file a Section 23(b)(3) disclosure with the City Clerk prior to applying – a copy of which I have attached.

For these reasons, you may conclude that Mr. Bregoli has cleared any ethics hurdles that might otherwise have blocked his candidacy for the coaching position.

Your role now is to consider whether to grant the exemption. Mr. Bregoli is not accepting the pay check for the coaching position – he will only accept one check from the city, and that will be the sum paid to elected School Committee members.

Upon your deliberation and vote, should you grant the exemption, City Clerk Nicole Crispo may sign on the council's behalf the Section 20(d) exemption form, which will then be filed in her office, with a copy to the State Ethics Commission. If you have any questions, I will be present to answer them, or you may contact me prior to the meeting.

Dear Mr. Bregoli:

This letter is a response to your request for advice about the conflict of interest law, G.L. c. 268A.

You are the Chair and a member of the Quincy School Committee. For the last four years, you have also been a soccer coach for the Quincy Public Schools. You have declined the salary for the coach position.

You are applying for a position as a basketball coach. If you are hired for this position, you will resign as soccer coach. You intend to decline the salary for the basketball coach position.

Section 20. Under § 20, while you serve as a municipal employee of the City of Quincy, you may not have a financial interest in a contract made by the City. If you can meet the requirements of an exemption under § 20, however, you may have a financial interest in a City contract.

You have told me that, as a School Committee member, you are a special municipal employee. If you get the position as a basketball coach, you must file a disclosure under § 20(d). In the disclosure, you should explain that you are a special municipal employee as a School Committee member, that you are adding on the position of basketball coach, and that you are declining the salary. You should file the disclosure with the City Council for their approval. After the City Council signs the disclosure, it must be filed with the City Clerk.


I have enclosed a § 20(d) form with this letter for your convenience.

Confidentiality. Both this letter and your request for advice are confidential by statute. This means that you are free to disclose this advice to anyone you wish, but that the State Ethics Commission may not disclose your request or any other identifying information unless you consent, or unless you misrepresent the contents of this letter.
