## **PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP-OFF DAY AND HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY SATURDAY, JUNE 5TH**

The following hazardous items will be accepted at the rear yard of the DPW, 55 Sea St., behind the Police Station from 8 to 10 A. M.

**Rx Drop-off 8 A. M. to 12 P. M.** Studies show that children can begin a lifetime of drug addiction simply by opening the medicine cabinet at home. Drugs such as OxyContin, oxycodone, hydrocodone, morphine, codeine, Percocet, Darvocet, Vicodin and Lortab have all been linked to opiate addiction.

Also there is concern about medications in the water supply not being adequately cleared by water treatment plants. Never flush medicine of any type down the toilet or drain.

**What to Bring:** All pharmaceuticals, prescription and over-the-counter medications in their original container. This includes pills, liquids, capsules, inhalers, patches, etc. Include all expired prescription medicines and any non-prescription medicines more than 2 years old. Sharps (needles) accepted.

**A Police Officer and pharmacist will be onsite to answer any questions and accept your unused medication. Sponsored by Mayor Koch's Drug Task Force, EDAN and Impact Quincy.**
