

Fair Housing Committee

The Quincy Fair Housing Committee was established in 1984 and is made up of members from a broad spectrum of public and private groups that include persons with a strong interest and desire to promulgate fair housing policy. The purpose of the Committee is to aid the City in its effort to foster a climate in which the individual human dignity and civil rights of all people are respected and where every potential homeowner has access to all housing regardless of race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, age, children, marital status, disability, sexual orientation, public assistance recipient, or gender.

The function of the Committee is to act in a monitoring and advisory capacity toward the implementation and evaluation of the City's fair housing policies. The Committee in conjunction with the Equal Opportunity Administrator, and the Department of Planning and Community Development is the public voice and advocating for the goals of Fair Housing.

The Fair Housing Committee over see's the development and implementation of the Fair Housing Plan. The Committee also takes a lead role in fair housing education throughout the City in the form of annual fair housing workshops, creating and distributing fair housing brochures (including translation into different languages), and as a referral service for residents, landlords, and housing industry representatives.
