## 2015-2016 Winter Parking Rules

October 15, 2015—April 15, 2016

### DURING A SNOW EMERGENCY:

- No parking is allowed on either side of Emergency Arteries. (For a complete list of Emergency Arteries go to the DPW web site at [www.quincyma.gov](http://www.quincyma.gov))
- Residents on non-emergency side streets are allowed to park on the ODD numbered side of the street this winter season. Residential parking permits are void during snow emergencies. Overnight parking on the street is prohibited without a residential parking permit which is available at the Quincy Police Department, 617-479-1212.

The average tow fee is \$125.00, plus cost of storage.

### Curbside Collection for the Holidays

There will be **No** curbside collection of trash or recycling on Friday, **December 25** due to the Christmas holiday. Collection for Friday will occur on Saturday, December 26.

There will be **No** curbside collection of trash or recycling on Friday, **January 1** due to the New Year holiday. Collection for Friday will occur on Saturday, January 2.

**Christmas trees** will be collected curbside on your regular trash day during the weeks of January 4 and January 11. Please remove all tree decorations. **DO NOT** wrap trees in plastic bags.

### Be a Good Neighbor!

Keep your sidewalk and steps clear of snow and ice for the mail carrier and police and fire fighters. Don't force school children to walk in the street. Help your elderly neighbors to shovel.

There are 9,329 catch basins in the city. Clearing catch basins near your home or business will allow rain or melting snow to enter the drainage system and not flood the street.

There are 2,549 hydrants in the city. Don't pile snow to obstruct a fire hydrant. In the interest of safety, clear and shovel out nearby fire hydrants.



## The DPW Yard

The DPW rear yard is now closed on Saturdays until April 23, 2016. The rear yard is open year-round, Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 3 pm to accept yardwaste, recycling, appliances, metal, electronics, textiles, books, CDs and audio/video tapes.

TVs and monitors are collected curbside on your regular trash day. You must call 617-376-7556 at least 2 business days before your regular trash day to arrange for pick-up.

Toilets, and construction demolition debris will not be collected curbside. Arrange for a private contractor to dispose of construction debris. You may bring toilets or construction debris to the Braintree Transfer Station, 257 Ivory St., Braintree. Call 781-843-6209 for more information. The DPW yard cannot take trash or construction material.
