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Special Provisions Relating to Work Funded Under American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

Quincy Community Action Programs, Inc. Head Start Facility

With respect to funds made available to State or local governments for infrastructure investments under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Pub. L. 111-5, Thomas P. Koch, Mayor of the City of Quincy, has certified by acceptance of Award Number DE-SC0003078 under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) program that the infrastructure investment described herein has received the full review and vetting required by law and that the Mayor accepts responsibility that the infrastructure investment is an appropriate use of taxpayers dollars.

Description of Investment: Purchase and installation of energy efficient heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems for the facility located at 22 Pray Street, Quincy. The EECBG investment is a component of a comprehensive retrofit of this 1941 elementary school building. The renovated facility is expected to open in December 2011 and will accommodate classrooms as well as administrative space for the regional Head Start program that serves children and families in Quincy and other South Shore towns.
