


Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Day

* Mercury containing items not disposed of properly such as thermostats, thermometers, fluorescent tubes, CFL (swirly) light bulbs, button batteries and mercuriochrome can damage the nervous system, brain, kidneys, liver and immune system.

When gathering products for the drop-off event leave materials in original containers and tighten all caps and lids. Sort and pack items separately in sturdy upright boxes. NEVER MIX CHEMICALS. Pack your car the morning of the event and drive directly to the DPW. Do not smoke while handling hazardous material and do not bring children in the car with you.

Items not accepted at Drop-off Day are tires, ammunition, fireworks, propane tanks, explosives, commercial/industrial/biological waste, prescription medicine and radioactive waste.
