Agenda 1. Hearing regarding the request of The Forbes Booster Club for a One-day Wine & Malt Permit for a fundraising event Saturday April 10, 2010, 7-12PM @ St. Ann's School Hall. Ms. Susan O'Connor, present. The event will benefit the dancers in their trip to Orlando for the championship. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Director Duca. All in favor. 5-0

Agenda 2. Hearing regarding the request of Gunther Tootie's, 1253 Hancock St., for a Cabaret License and extension of hours to 10PM. Ms. Lesley Mai, present. The owners would like to offer soft music on Friday nights for a couple hours. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Director Duca. All in favor. 5-0

Agenda 3. Hearing regarding the request of Have 2 Run Productions for a permit to host a Road Race Sunday June 20, 2010. Ms. Emma Bagnell present. Chairman Shea reviewed all the races held in Quincy noting this race is scheduled for Father's Day @ Marina Bay. Ms. Bagnell stated this race is based on the Iron Girl Race of 2006 held in Quincy noting this is a popular location for runners as it draws runners from Boston & Quincy. She expects 300-500 runners, would like more. Captain Gillan noted the race would impact Dunkin Donut's on East Squantum & Quincy Shore Drive. Commissioner Scheele reviewed the entry fees and Chief Barron questioned if Have 2 Run is non profit. Ms. Bagnell stated Have 2 Run is a sole proprietorship, a charity is selected and a donation is made. Chairman Shea introduced Trustees of Marina Bay, Ms. Maureen Glynn, Chair of Trustees of Marina Point, Mr. Paul Thomas, Trustee Marina Point Civic Assn. & Steven Korchin, Trustee Marina Point/Marina Point Access. All expressed their opposition to this race and other races, noting residents own the roads and also pay for the upkeep. Questions of liability, noise and impact on traffic and business, especially on Father's Day were raised. Chairman Shea read letters and e-mails of opposition into the record. Chairman Shea asked for a recess to give Ms. Bagnell and the Marina Bay representative's time to discuss the race.

Mr. Shea explained the applicants brother has left the corporation state law requires a new application.
