**WHEREAS**, Steward Health Care has announced on November 6, 2014 its intent to close Quincy Medical Center, a 196 bed acute care hospital founded in 1890, that has provided medical, surgical and emergency services to the people of Quincy and neighboring South Shore communities for 124 years with as many as 38,594 ER visits and 70,718 outpatient visits annually, such closure to occur as of December 31, 2014, and

**WHEREAS**, Quincy Medical Center as the second largest employer in the city with more than 650 employees has been an economic engine in the city whose closure will have impact on those employees, the community, the municipality and the local economy, and

**WHEREAS**, Manet Community Health has a partnership and satellite facility within the Medical Center serving more than 3,000 patients annually, and the impending closure of the Medical Center raises concerns for the future of this alliance of care,

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED** that the Quincy City Council conduct a hearing and receive testimony at its meeting of November 17, 2014, or as soon as practicable thereafter, with regard to the announced closing of the Quincy Medical Center and that a request for appearance before this body be extended to representatives of Quincy Medical Center/Steward Health Care, Manet Community Health Care, The MNA and SEIU and other persons with relevant professional knowledge related to the presenting circumstances.
