



Adams Green Transportation Improvement Project

Is the southerly portion of Hancock Street between the United First Parish Church and the Old Town Hall really going to be discontinued for general vehicular traffic?

YES, and we think it's a good thing! Not only will this project include wider sidewalks, new trees, safer pedestrian access, and improved, smarter traffic flow around the United First Parish Church, this project will allow for the City of Quincy to move forward with the construction of the Adams Green public park space. Adams Green—first identified in the 2006 City of Quincy Downtown Vision Plan, entails the creation of a contiguous urban park space that knit together transportation, historical, and architectural assets, including the MBTA station, Old Town Hall, the United First Parish Church, the Thomas Crane Public Library, and the Hancock Cemetery. Because Hancock Street is an ancient way, the existing linear geometry of the right-of-way will be maintained through the length of the future park, and will function as a promenade for people.
