Agenda 1. Hearing regarding the request of Sully's Spa, 28 Chestnut St, for a One-day Extension of Premise, Saturday June 7, 2014. Mr. Brian Sullivan.  Brian Sullivan present for the request for the extension for the 80th Anniversary Celebration. The extension is for 4 tables that will be roped off. 12 midnight they will end the outside. Noon-Midnight outside. **Motion: Approve** by ANDREW SCHEELE, **Seconded by** PAUL KEENAN

Agenda 4. Hearing regarding the request of Angelo's Coal Fired Pizza, LLC, 1657 Hancock St, Patrick J. Cross, Manager, for a CV All Alcoholic Restaurant License and Cabaret License. Attorney Peter Shea.  Attorney Shea, present with proposed manager, Patrick Cross. The postal cards were given to Chairman Shea, the Patriot Ledger Ad ran March 27, 2014 and all abutters were

notified by Attorney Shea. The 190 seat restaurant will have a sprinkler system. Mr. Cross is a Quincy resident and has experience in the restaurant business. Chairman Shea read a letter from Mr. Ed Regan of Adams Street questioning the application and notification of abutters. Chairman Shea explained what a Cabaret License is: 3 pieces or less, usually a piano, karaoke, or DJ. The name Cabaret is only a term. Mr. Cross stated occasionally they may have use for the Cabaret license. The ovens will be coal fired and all will be inspected by building & fire. Chief Barron noted the sprinkler system also will be inspected, plans must be submitted to Fire Prevention. **Motion:** Pending All inspections. , **Action: Approve, by ANDREW SCHEELE, Seconded by PAUL KEENAN .**

Agenda 5. Hearing regarding the request of Reebok International, LTD., for a One Day Wine & Malt Special Use Permit @ the Fore River Shipyard, Sunday April 27, 2014.  Tiffany Kinder & Colleen Cosgrove present for the request. Reebok plans to use the interior of the shipyard, with set up on the 18th for the event on the 27th. They also have a structural engineer, and a Bar Manager. All bartenders are TIPS certified. All 800 people that they plan to invite are either Reebok employees or customers of Reebok. They will be show casing the new apparel and new label. They are insured and have included Quincy in the million dollar policy. There will be EMT coverage along with police details. Colleen explained this is more or less a road show for retailers showing new lines of clothing and fitness equipment etc. for 2015. Hours planned are 7:00 PM-2AM. All attendees will be bussed in and out to hotels.

The larger warehouse will be used for the event. Entertainment will be a celebrity DJ mainly acoustical music. Commissioner Duca asked the applicant to join him and the police & fire chiefs at police headquarters Friday 9AM to discuss plans for the event. Commissioner Scheele asked about the bathroom facilities. They will bring in high end port-a-pottys, with running water, food trucks mostly from Boston, all will be permitted and will check in with the Health Dept. for temporary food permits. **Motion: Approve, Special Use Permit and Wine & Malt License, ANDREW SCHEELE, Seconded by PAUL KEENAN .**
