



CITY OF QUINCY **BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS**

The Board of License Commissioners of the City of Quincy met in Council Chambers on Tuesday, February 1, 2011 at 4:00 P.M. with Chairman Joseph P. Shea presiding. Also present, Police Chief Paul Keenan, Inspectional Services Director James Duca, Health Commissioner Andrew Scheele, Fire Chief Joseph Barron, Lt. Peter Turowski, Det. Leo Coppens.

Agenda 1. Hearing regarding the request of Boston Marriott Quincy to extend their Liquor License to 2 A.M. for the Annual Ahearn Family Foundation Event Saturday March 19, -Sunday March 20 (2 A.M.), 2011. Ms. Meg Garruto, Event Manager, present. Commissioner Scheele motioned to grant the annual request, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Agenda 2. Continued hearing of January 25, 2011 regarding the request of The National Multiple Sclerosis Society for a permit to hold the 27th Annual Cape Cod Getaway MS Bike Ride, June 25th & 26, 2011. Mr. Drew Davis, continued to March 22, 2011, at the applicants request.

Agenda 3. Chairman Shea distributed a copy of the License Board Rules & Guidelines adding this was updated in the past, and now you have a new package. I am looking to update and combine etc., and put this in booklet form. I may enlist some help to put this in order. It talks about a lot of things some repetitive. This is an effort to get everything into one document. I will keep this active on the calendar. I would like to get this done for the summer.

Agenda 4. Hearing regarding the request of the Asian American Association of Quincy, 1073 Hancock St., for a One-day permit, February 20, 5:30-9:30 PM @ 28 Hayward St. for their Chinese New Year Celebration. On the motion of Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan, the Board granted the request 5-0.

Agenda 5. Continued hearing of November 30, 2010 regarding the request of Quincy Mini Mart & Gas, Inc. d/b/a Furnace Brook Gas & Convenience, 507 Furnace Brook Parkway for a CV License. Osberto A. Rodriguez, Manager, present. Chairman Shea stated the board was notified in the fall it was on the agenda as gas/repair and cv. On or about November 23 we were notified by an Attorney in Boston regarding a dispute of the gas station, we sent it to the City Solicitor who has been working with everyone on this. We are the board that gives both licenses. The CV license has expired it needs to be renewed. Ward Councillor Doug Gutro added "we all know this location as the Jenny Gas Station." When it was originally posted on the first agenda it was not to repair vehicles. Most neighbors don't know why it closed in the first place. Is it a matter of legal issue, will he be coming back later"? The Board agreed they would not support two owners, Mr. Rodriguez stated he wants to be the owner/operator of both the store and gas station. He stated the Court has issued an eviction notice to the former operator, he is just waiting and is confident he will return to apply for the gas license. Chief Barron added assuming your successful today you need to contact our fire prevention for a walk thru and for the record I will not support two owners. Commissioner Scheele asked Mr. Rodriguez if he has any plans of selling beer or wine down the road or full alcohol? Mr. Rodriguez stated "it's not my intention. If something would come along maybe, but it's not my intent". Councillor Gutro added "can I just say that would be a completely separate issue. The neighbors want to see it as its former use with a friendly environment. If he entertains Beer & Wine he should be ready for opposition from the neighbors. With no other questions Commissioner Scheele motioned to grant the request, second Chief Keenan. All in favor
