**Chapter 304 Open Meeting Law read into the record by Vice Chair Joseph Duca**

- Agenda 1.** Hearing regarding request for a Special Use Permit from the South Shore YMCA, 79 Coddington Street for the 6th Annual SSYMCA Frozen 5K Road Race. Thomas Healy. Phil Gay for Thomas Healy. The race for the January 8 2017, @ 9AM-11PM was explained by Mr. Gay. Councillor Laforest supports the run. Mr. Gay agreed to contact Captain DiBona at the Quincy Police Dept. Motion to grant made by Paul Keenan, second Chief Barron. All in favor
- Agenda 2.** Hearing regarding the request of The Woodward School, 1102 Hancock Street for 2 One Day Wine & Malt Permits for Fund Raisers, October 13 & November 19, 2016. Ms. Sarah Hogan, present with Walter Hubley. The Oct.13 event 6-8:30 PM @Webster Hall, Adults only. Nov 19, event, 5-9PM @ 1102 Hancock St. @Woodward School. They expect about 200 people, The Catering Smith will operate the wine and malt events with TIP's Certified servers and Time Out Pizza will provide food. Councilor LA forest supports. Motion to grant made by Paul Keenan, second Chief Barron. All in favor
- Agenda 3.** Hearing regarding the status of the CV All Alcohol Restaurant License issued to L & M Presidential Enterprises, LLC, d/b/a China Pearl International, Yu Mei Zhang, Manager. Chief Keenan asked Peter Turowski to read the police report of September 3, 2016 submitted by Officer Jeffrey Bossart.  
The report listed in part charges of disorderly conduct, resisting arrest and assault and battery of a police officer. Report of a fight where a gun was shown, Sgt. JP Kelley arrived to assist there were numerous fights going on. Ambulances were called; all involved parties refused medical attention. 15 police officers were needed along with Braintree Police Quincy unites responded along with Braintree police and Brewster Ambulance. The manager never called for a detail, which is required by the City. Mr. Moy, who reported he spends most of his time in Boston's China Pearl, stated the manager, for the past 2 ½ years Annie Mak, was

confused. The hall that night was rented for a wedding of 600. She claimed she was never told she needed a detail. Lt. Turowski informed her of the need for a detail per the City Ordinance. She also reported they have weddings weekly. Lt. Turowski told Mr. Moy he must call for a detail or call him directly. The last time a detail was called for was January 1, 2015.

Mr. Moy admitted that everything Lt. Turowski noted was true. He reported he has changed protocol and hired more help and will call for details. Chief Keenan spoke to Mr. Moy explaining that there were 4 people arrested and all of the Quincy Police responding, along with Braintree and Brewster Ambulance. Director Duca asked what type of security he hires. Mr. Moy stated he is trying to recruit security and that his functions will be at a minimum now, the wedding season is over. They still serve Dim Sum and dinner. Wedding functions have been rolled back to 11PM. Chief Keenan noted when there is a large function with dancing, alcohol and music he needs to call for a detail, and when there are 600 guests he will need more than 1 detail. Chief Barron added he is greatly disturbed that all our police were tied up at his establishment, Braintree Police and Brewster Ambulance. He commended that our officers showed enormous restraint in the use of their guns. Director Duca echoed Chief Barron's remarks. Motion to issue a written warning to be placed in the file for the life of the property. Second Chief Barron., All in favor.

**Agenda 4.** Hearing regarding the status of the Common Victualer License issued to Good Fortune Supermarket, 226 Quincy Ave. Zi Feng Li. Director Duca met with the owner, there have been neighborhood complaints regarding the dumpster he has worked out a resolution. Motion placed on file.

The Board accepted the minutes of the previous hearing and waived the reading.
