The Board of License Commissioners of the City of Quincy met in Council Chambers on Tuesday June 29, 2010 at 4:00 P.M. with Chairman Joseph P. Shea presiding. Also present, Police Chief Paul Keenan, Fire Chief Joseph Barron, Inspectional Services Director Jay Duca, Health Commissioner Andrew Scheele, Liquor Inspector Lt. Peter Turowski & Det. Leo Coppens, Captain Tom Lyons, QFD

Agenda 1. Hearing regarding the request of Beechwood Knoll School, 220 Fenno St. for a One-day Permit for the 13th Annual Fall Festival, Saturday October 2, 2010. Ms. Robin Franceschini. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Agenda 2. Hearing regarding the request of Father Bill's Mainspring for a One-day Permit for the 15th Annual Food Fest, Tuesday July 27, 2010 @ The Ocean Club, Marina Bay. Mr. John Yazwinski, present. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Ms. Mary Kelly, present. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Agenda 5. Hearing regarding the request of Mark P. Kennedy for a One Day Permit for the 3rd Annual Jamie Cochrane Memorial Road Race, September 12, 2010 @ 10:00 AM. Mark Kennedy, present. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Director Duca. All in favor.

Agenda 6. Hearing regarding the general appearance of Subway, 247 Quincy Ave. Nelofur Siddiqui, Manager, present. Chairman Shea noted he visited the site and noticed a drastic change and asked Mr. Siddiqui to keep up the good work. Commissioner Scheele motioned to place the matter on file, second Chief Keenan. Agenda 7. Hearing regarding the request of Mr. Peter Dawson, d/b/a The Lobster Stop, 723 Washington St. for a Common Victualer License. Mr. Dawson and Attorney Rob Fleming present explained Mr. Dawson has operated in the area for over 30 years. He plans to lease 1600 sq. ft. of the site for the Lobster Stop. All zoning has been approved and parking is adequate. Councillor Dan Raymondi spoke in favor adding he has received a lot of support for the applicant. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Agenda 8. Hearing regarding the general appearance of Supreme Pizza, 271 Quincy Ave. Mr. Arte Luarasi, Manager, present stated he will pay more attention to the outside and understands the Board's concerns. Motion to place the matter on file made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Barron. All in favor.

Agenda 9. Not on the Agenda: Request of Gunther Tootie's, 1356 Hancock St. to add 2 outside tables with 4 chairs each. Chairman Shea noted the area of Hancock Street is wide enough to accommodate the request. The applicants have also signed the City's Hold Harness Agreement; Chairman Shea has also consulted with the Historical Commission. Motion to grant the request made by Commissioner Scheele, second Chief Keenan. All in favor.

Agenda 10. Hearing regarding report received from Lt. Peter Turowski Re: South Garden Seafood Restaurant, Quincy Ave., Matthew Thoi, Manager. RE: May 22, 2010- Violation of Chapter 138 §34, (Service of alcohol to a minor.) Lt. Turowski read his report of the incident. Mr. Thoi present stated this was totally his employee's mistake and promised it will not happen again. With no other violations Chief Keenan motioned to place the matter on file for one year from today's hearing. Chairman Shea took the following vote:

Agenda 11. Hearing regarding report of May 22, 2010 received from Lt. Peter Turowski, QPD Liquor Inspector Re: Quincy Discount Liquors, 275 Quincy Ave. Maryanne Dao, Manager. Re: Violation of Chapter 138 §34 (service of alcohol to a minor). Lt. Turowski read his report of the incident adding this is the 2nd

violation; the first violation was March 19, 2010. Lt. Turowski added he has spoken with Ms. Dao before and stated "she just doesn't get the message". Ms. Dao stated she replaced the previous clerk, her brother in law, because of a language problem. Chairman Shea stated as the holder of the license she is responsible and she must get reliable people. Chief Barron added how hard it is to the Fire & Police personnel to respond to accidents to youths and how it affects families. Ms. Dao agreed to accompany her employee to TIP's Training. Chief Keenan motioned to impose a 3 day suspension, with one day, Saturday, July 31, 2010 to be served and the remaining days placed on file for one year from today's hearing. Motion to suspend the Retail All Alcohol Package Store License for 3 days, with one day, July 31, 2010 to be served and the remaining 2 days placed on file for one year from June 29, 2010. All in favor.

Agenda 12. . Hearing regarding report of May 22, 2010 received from Lt. Peter Turowski, QPD, Liquor Inspector Re: Point Liquors, 230 Washington St. George Deschenes, Manager. Violation of Chapter 138 §34, service of alcohol to a minor. Mr. Deschenes stated the store will now operate with a zero tolerance and that he feels as bad as everyone else that this happened. He has instructed all employees to ID everyone. Lt. Turowski noted no problems before with his store. Chief Keenan proposed a written warning in light of the 9 years incident free record. Chairman Shea took the following vote:
