



The City Council of the City of Quincy met on Monday, April 4, 2011 in the City Hall Council Chambers with City Council President Kevin F. Coughlin presiding. Present were Councilors Finn, Gutro, Keenan, Laforest, McFarland, McNamee, Palmucci and Raymond.

President Coughlin opened the meeting in recognition of the men and women serving in the military both at home and abroad. He dedicated the meeting to Connie Mele, who recently passed away.

Joseph Shea, City Clerk, addressed the Council to provide information on the U.S. Census. The City of Quincy has passed the 90,000 resident mark, which is significant in that federal reimbursement is determined by the number of residents. The official number from the census is 92,271, a 4.81% gain from ten years ago. These census figures will create the need to re-precinct the City, however, they do not have the census block information at this point. Statewide there will be redistricting as well.

Acceptance of gift of \$1,400.00 from various donors for D.A.R.E. program. Councilor McFarland moved to accept. On the motion made by Councilor McFarland, seconded by Councilor Palmucci with a recommendation it ought to pass, the order passed by an 8-0 roll call vote.
